Decision on Western Energy Imbalance Market assistance energy transfer proposal

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Management proposes two changes to assistance energy transfer rules

- 1. Remove the December 31, 2025, sunset provision for the assistance energy transfer feature to ensure this reliability tool does not expire.
- 2. Create an exemption so surcharges will not apply to any transfers that arise because a WEIM balancing authority takes actions for the purposes of ensuring continued reliable operations, working with a reliability coordinator.

Assistance energy transfers: background

- Assistance energy transfers are an optional feature where a balancing area that fails a resource sufficiency evaluation test can receive energy transfers through the market at a surcharge.
- Without this option, when entities fail the sufficiency evaluation, their transfers are limited to the last amounts they were able to transfer before they failed.
- Market-based alternative for providing energy during stressed or emergency operating conditions.
- Approved by WEM Governing Body and ISO Board of Governors in December 2022.

Eliminating the sunset provision ensures this reliability feature does not expire

- Management proposes to remove the December 31, 2025, sunset provision for the assistance energy transfer feature.
- The assistance energy transfer feature is widely supported and broadly understood to improve the reliability of WEIM balancing areas.
- Does not preclude the ISO from working with stakeholders on further refinements.

Assistance energy transfers and reliability actions

- Management proposes to create an exemption for assistance energy transfer surcharges that are due to actions taken working with the Reliability Coordinator.
- Ensures that balancing areas are not compelled to weigh potential surcharge liabilities against reliability-driven actions.

Stakeholders universally support the proposal

- All stakeholders who have participated in the initiative support the ISO's proposed changes.
- Stakeholders agree directionally with the exemption for reliability coordinated actions but request better understanding of how exemptions would be applied.
 - Management commits to specifying relevant scenarios within business practice manuals.

Management recommends approval of the WEIM assistance energy transfer proposal

- Proposal removes December 31, 2025, sunset provision for the assistance energy transfer feature to ensure this reliability tool does not expire.
- Proposal creates an exemption for assistance energy transfer surcharges that arise following a WEIM balancing area taking actions with a reliability coordinator.
- Proposal is supported by stakeholders and enables balancing areas to continue to leverage the market's efficient dispatch that enhances western interconnection reliability.
