Selection Policy for the EIM Governing Body

- EIM Governing Body is a five-member body that exercises delegated authority over the rules of the ISO's Western Energy Imbalance Market
- Selection process was proposed by the EIM Transitional Committee in August 2015, and the resulting policy was approved by the ISO Board in December 2015
- Policy provides that members of the EIM Governing Body be selected by a Nominating Committee comprised of a diverse set of stakeholder representatives



EIM Nominating Committee Deliberations

- EIM Nominating Committee is <u>consensus-driven</u> in its deliberations, identifying candidates that meet the directives of the Selection Policy for the EIM Governing Body
- On January 31, the Nominating Committee reached consensus on the following two candidates, for terms beginning July 1, 2019, and ending June 30, 2022:
 - > Valerie Fong
 - John Prescott



Approval of Slate of Nominees

- Pursuant to the Selection Policy for the EIM Governing Body, the EIM Nominating Committee's final slate is subject to approval by the EIM Governing Body in an open meeting
- Pursuant to the Charter for EIM Governance (and except for the first terms of the initial Members), Members of the EIM Governing Body serve three-year terms, and may serve a maximum of three terms
