Rob Taylor is responsible for the development of federal energy regulatory policy and NERC compliance. He manages APS's relationship with the Federal Energy Regulatory Commission and oversees their compliance efforts with NERC reliability standards. He joined APS in November of 2017. Prior to joining APS, he spent 14 years at Salt River Project in a variety roles including leading their regulatory department and as a regulatory attorney. Rob was an integral member of SRP's EIM evaluation team and ultimate

decision to join the EIM.

In addition to his work on SRP's internal EIM evaluation, Rob helped launch a west-wide working group of the American Public Power Association to consider the impacts of EIM and potential regionalization efforts.
