ISO Stakeholder Process Overview and Update

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Stakeholder input is essential for successful market development and infrastructure planning

- ISO uses a consistent process for obtaining stakeholder input on policy initiatives
- All stakeholders have equal opportunity to participate and comment in the decision-making process
- Issues affect our market design, policies, implementation and infrastructure planning activities

Stakeholder Initiative Process



Stakeholders can engage in every phase of the process, starting with policy development through implementation

Steps to manage a transparent stakeholder process

Stakeholder Initiative Process



The following activities occur at each stage in the stakeholder process





Issue Paper development



- Develop issue paper based on stakeholder feedback, FERC directive, or needed market change
- Post paper to webpage and send out market notice at least one week prior to meeting
- All meetings are recorded
- Host meeting with stakeholders

Improvements to the proposal development process begin this winter



- Draft proposal, draft business requirement specifications (BRS), and draft tariff are developed concurrently
- Post to ISO webpage and send out market notice
- Post presentations 2 days before meeting
- Host meetings with stakeholders

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Final comments received and the final proposal is submitted to the EIM Governing Body and/or the ISO Board for decision



- Receive final stakeholder positions on draft final proposal
- Present proposal and stakeholder positions to the EIM Governing Body and/or the ISO Board
- Receive decision and proceed with implementation if approved

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FERC acceptance process may include stakeholder comments, conditions or changes for implementation



- Finalize documents and submit for FERC acceptance
- If necessary, respond to stakeholder comments at FERC
- Receive order from FERC
- If necessary, make revisions or file compliance documents
- Implement accepted changes

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Implementation activities and go-live



- Draft business practice manuals (BPM)
- Receive comments from stakeholders and revise BPM
- Post to ISO webpage and send out market notice
- Initiate market simulation
