

Statement of Interest from Vijay Singh - PacifiCorp WEM Regional Issues Forum – Extended Day Ahead Market Sector Liaison

To Whom It May Concern,

I am writing to express my interest in becoming the Extended Day-Ahead Market (EDAM) sector liaison in the Western Energy Markets Regional Issues Forum (RIF).

PacifiCorp is an investor-owned utility serving over 2 million customers across California, Idaho, Oregon, Utah, Washington and Wyoming. The company owns and operates almost 11 GW of generation capacity and over 17,000 miles of high-voltage transmission. PacifiCorp was an original member of the Western Energy Imbalance Market (WEIM) along with the California Independent System Operator (CAISO) starting in 2014. Following the success of the WEIM, PacifiCorp was the first entity to sign an agreement to join the EDAM. PacifiCorp is an active participant in many stakeholder initiatives across the West, including the CAISO stakeholder process as well as being a Launch Committee member and funder of the West-Wide Governance Pathway Initiative (Pathways).

As a Senior Organized Market Analyst at PacifiCorp, I am responsible for leading PacifiCorp's participation in many of the initiatives in the CAISO stakeholder process along with other market-related initiatives in the West, like Bonneville Power Administration's day-ahead market stakeholder process and tracking the development of Markets+. I am also responsible for providing data analysis to PacifiCorp teams on various outcomes of the Company's participation in the WEIM. This includes analysis on significant market events, EIM benefit actuals and forecasts, and transfer patterns.

Before my time at PacifiCorp, I was a Market Operations Engineer at the Electricity Reliability Council of Texas (ERCOT), the independent system operator (ISO) for the Texas Interconnection. My time at ERCOT gave me valuable insights into the innerworkings of day-ahead and real-time markets from the perspective of an ISO and an understanding of a market participant-led stakeholder process. I hold a Master of Engineering degree in Electrical and Computer Engineering from the University of Texas at Austin and a bachelor's degree in Electrical and Electronics Engineering from the University of Washington.

As the EDAM sector liaison to the RIF, I will provide representation for entities that have decided to join the EDAM to broaden the scope of perspectives shared among RIF members. I look forward to contributing to the success of the RIF as an important advisory body for the EDAM and WEIM.
