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BPA Profile

- BPA is a federal power marketing administration headquartered in Portland.
- BPA is part of the U.S. Department of Energy, but it is self-funded.
- Congress created BPA in 1937.
- BPA markets power from 31
 Federal dams, 1 nonfederal nuclear plant, and several small nonfederal generators.
- BPA operates and maintains 15,000 circuit miles of transmission line.




BPA Customers




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Grid Modernization Initiative

- Grid Modernization Portfolio:
 - support a more reliable, flexible and efficient system,
 - help reduce future costs and
 - create new market opportunities.
- Grid Modernization projects bring value to BPA and its customers independent of the EIM.
- If BPA chooses not to participate in the EIM, then the EIM Implementation projects will not be pursued.



EIM Relationship




BPA Balancing Authority shown in grey

- EIM Entities use BPA transmission
- Coordinated Transmission Agreement with CAISO
- Serve load in EIM Entity Balancing Authorities
- Currently evaluating how and under what conditions BPA could join the EIM.

Principles for EIM Evaluation

- 1. Participation is consistent with statutory, regulatory, and contractual obligations.
- 2. Maintain reliable delivery of power and transmission to our customers.
- 3. Resource participation in the EIM is and always will be voluntary.
- 4. BPA's decision to participate in the EIM will be based on a sound business rationale.
