The Catalog Process

- The Stakeholder Initiatives Catalog captures
 - Initiatives submitted by Stakeholders or added by ISO and included in the Catalog
 - Initiatives excluded from the Catalog
 - Discretionary items identified by Stakeholders and ISO staff
 - Non-discretionary initiatives
- Non-discretionary items include
 - System reliability
 - Efficient and reliable market function
 - Regulatory requirement




The Catalog Process, continued

- Initiatives include policy issues that typically entail Tariff changes – not simply administrative or software changes
- Stakeholder submissions to the Catalog are welcome year-around
- The Catalog is generally updated twice each year, so there are cutoffs in January and July for submissions to be included in the next update
- The Catalog informs the Roadmap process...



Catalog Update and Roadmap Development Process






The Roadmap Process


- On an annual basis, following the fall update to the Catalog, the ISO develops a Roadmap for the upcoming three years, and a detailed plan for the upcoming year
- The Roadmap captures the policy, Tariff, and implementation timelines for the initiatives the ISO is undertaking and plans to undertake over the next three years
- A detailed plan for the upcoming year is also developed

The Roadmap Process

- The Roadmap process balances many competing constraints
 - Policy development
 - Legal input, Tariff changes
 - Development of detailed business requirements
 - Business Process Manual changes
 - Implementation considerations, including ISO staff as well as ISO vendors
 - FERC timelines
 - Stakeholder input on implementation hurdles








2022 Draft Annual Plan

Opportunities for Input

- Twice annually, generally January and July, there is a call for Stakeholders to submit items to the Policy Initiatives Catalog
 - However we accept submissions all year around
- The ISO published an updated Catalog and solicits Stakeholder comments
 - Comments due on the current iteration 9/23
- The final Catalog is published, Roadmap is developed, and posted for comment at the end of the calendar year
